What's NOT Considered Auxiliary Community Outreach

- Volunteer work for the benefit of the Post or Auxiliary is not considered Community Outreach.
- Repairs or maintenance to Post Home.
- Cooking or serving a meal for Post or Auxiliary fundraiser
- Buddy[®] Poppy distribution
- VFW or VFW Auxiliary meetings, conventions, conferences or schools of instruction Church activities for one specific congregation and not the entire community (e.g. usher, elder, deacon, minister, etc.)
