I have counted each of these Auxiliaries as having reported; however, some of the reports showed activities that I cannot count as participation in the Outreach program because another organization was not involved in the event.

Remember one of the requirements is that you must be volunteer for or with another organization. There are still nine Auxiliaries who have not sent in a report. I will not list them, but if you are not sure if your Auxiliary is one of them, please contact me.

I now have a second email listed above that I am using because I have been unable to get problems with my old provider worked out.

Here are a few more ideas of things you can do under the Outreach program:

- 1. Work with Senior and or Disability Resource Center to identify elderly or disabled persons in need of rides to doctor's appointments, banks, pharmacy, grocery store, etc. Then volunteer to provide transportation when needed.
- 2. Work with faith-based organizations and Senior Centers to befriend people who are homebound and volunteer to visit them and read, play music, play card/games, or just talk and share some laugh with them.
- 3. Volunteer to organize donations, arrange merchandiser, or work as a cashier at a thrift shop.
- 4. Work with homeless and/or women's shelters to help collect items such as clothing, books, toys, food, and cleaning supplies.
- 5. Work with neighborhood associations, local senior center, or disability resource centers helping those in need of basic handyman services by providing household chores, winterizing house, and installing ramps or handrails.
