#### **Quartermaster General on bonding**

I have recently received several inquiries regarding the subject of bonding. Specifically, Quartermasters are asking if insurance is an acceptable alternative to the requirement that accountable officers be bonded. The information below seeks to clarify this requirement and the difference between bonds and insurance.

VFW By-Laws Section 703 Bonds states:

Each officer accountable for funds or property pursuant to any provision of these Bylaws shall be bonded with an indemnity company as surety in a sum at least equal to the amount of liquid assets for which, so far as can be anticipated, they may be accountable. The bond premium shall be paid from the funds of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Department, District, County Council, or Post, as the case may be, to which each officer is accountable.

The bonds of such accountable officers, in amount and as to surety, shall be approved by their respective units and held by their respective Commanders. The Commander of each unit shall be responsible for the proper and adequate bonding of all accountable officers in their unit.

Sections 218, 418, and 518 of the Manual of Procedures require bonding of the Quartermasters at each level.

The purpose of bonding is to protect the VFW against actions of the Quartermaster, or other officer being bonded.

There is a difference between bonds and insurance.

A surety bond is an agreement under which one party (the surety company) guarantees to another party (VFW) the performance of an obligation by a third party (the accountable officer). Surety bonds do not have a deductible and do not require a conviction of the officer in order to be paid for the loss. Surety bonds serve to protect the obliged party (VFW) against losses that result from the failure of the principal (accountable officer) to meet their obligation.

Insurance is an agreement under which one party (the insurance company) guarantees protection to another party (VFW) due to dishonesty, forgery, computer fraud, theft, etc. Crime or employee dishonesty insurance policies may be subject to a deductible and may require a conviction of the officer, which can take time, before payment will be made.

So any policy that provides insurance against theft where there is a deductible and a conviction is required is not considered a bond. A bond is taken out by a party (post) to cover a specific person (post officer) who promises to act in a certain way. There is never a deductible, and no conviction is required. An insurance policy will generally apply to all officers, volunteers and employees who have access to Post funds. Posts need to look at the terms of the contract to make sure they getting are a bond and not an insurance policy. In many cases, a post may need both an insurance policy for the post and a bond for the individual handling funds.

### **Discipline of Members**

Attention of all members is directed to Section 901 of the National Bylaws, "Discipline of Members." Members who have committed offenses recognized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may be subject to disciplinary action. Members are reminded that acts of Sexual Harassment, Racial or Sexual Discrimination, and all other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline or conduct determined to be unbecoming of a member will not be condoned. In general, harassment and discrimination consists of any form of verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe and/or pervasive enough to have the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or otherwise interfering with another's ability to participate in VFW events. All members should be treated with dignity and respect.

#### Arrears

Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National Bylaws concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post-Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council and District meetings; County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

4. Trustees shall not be eligible to serve as an elected officer, Adjutant or on a committee whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees. Among the duties of the three (3) elected Post Trustees, they shall:
A) At least monthly, review the Monthly Report of Receipts and Expenditures of the Post Quartermaster.
B) Within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, properly audit the books and records of the Post Quartermaster, Post Adjutant and any activity, clubroom, holding company or unit sponsored, conducted or operated by, for or on behalf of the Post and submit a Post Trustee's Report of Audit to the Department Quartermaster for referral to the Department Inspector.

 $\hat{\mathbf{C}}$ ) The Report shall be in accordance with and upon such form as may be prescribed by the Adjutant General. The audit shall be signed by the Post Commander and Trustees, who shall, by their signatures, certify to the accuracy of the information contained therein.

**D**) Perform such other duties as may be incident to the office or may from time to time be required by the laws and usages of the organization or lawful orders from proper authority.

## FLY THE FLAG ON MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR'S BIRTHDAY.

The U.S. federal flag code has been amended by Congress and signed by the president to add Martin Luther King, Jr. Day to the list of days on which the flag should be displayed. His birthday is observed on the third Monday in January; therefore, the flag should be flown on that day. To purchase a U.S. flag from the VFW Store, go to http://www.vfwstore.org/category/flags/usflags.

Many communities are conducting community service projects that day. It is highly suggested that all members support this day of service

## Commanders

## Section 216. Elected and Appointed Officers; Chairmen and Committees.

- (a) The officers of each Post will consist of a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Adjutant, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and three (3) Trustees.
- (b) The Post shall elect the Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and three trustees.
- (c) The appointed officers of each Post shall consist of at least an Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day, Service Officer and Guard to be appointed as prescribed in Section 216 in the Manual of Procedures.
