4	(1) In training for or trained for the purpose of search and		
5	rescue;		
6	(2) Owned by an independent handler or a member of a search and		
7	rescue team; and		
8	(3) Used in conjunction with local law enforcement or emergency		
9	services organizations for the purpose of locating missing persons or		
10	evidence of arson.		
11	(a) As used in this chapter, "service animal" means a dog that is		
12	trained specifically to do work or to perform tasks for the benefit of an		
13	individual with a disability, including without limitation:		
14	(1) A guide dog or a trained dog that serves as a travel		
15	assistant for an individual who has severe visual impairment or is blind;		
16	(2) A signal dog or a dog trained to alert when a sound occurs		
17	an individual who has a significant hearing loss or is deaf;		
18	(3) A service dog or a dog trained to perform tasks that assist		
19	an individual with a disability;		
20	(4) An assistance animal or a dog trained and used to assist an		
21	individual with a disability;		
22	(5) A seizure alert animal or a dog trained to assist an		
23	individual with a seizure disorder when a particular medical event is about		
24	to occur or to respond to a medical event that has occurred;		
25	(6) A mobility animal or a dog that is being or has been trained		
26	to assist an individual with a disability caused by physical impairments;		
27	(7) A psychiatric service animal or a dog trained to assist an		
28	individual with a disability to detect the onset of psychiatric episodes and		
29	lessen the effects of the psychiatric episodes; or		
30	(8) A sensory service animal or a dog trained to assist an		
31	individual with autism or other sensory disorder.		
32	(b) A person who has a physical disability, mental disability,		
33	intellectual disability, or sensory disability shall have the right to be		
34	accompanied by a service animal on public ways, in public places, and in		
35	other public accommodations and housing accommodations prescribed in § 20-14		
36	303 and shall not be required to pay an extra fee or charge for the service

- 10 (e) Any  $\underline{A}$  person who kills or injures any service animal described in
- 11 this section or any search and rescue dog shall make restitution to the owner
- 12 of the animal.

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- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-14-308, concerning guide dog and service
- 15 dog access, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 20-14-308. Guide dog and service dog Service animal access.
- 17 (a) An individual with visual, hearing, or other physical disabilities
- 18 <u>a physical disability, mental disability, intellectual disability, or sensory</u>
- 19 <u>disability</u> and his or her <del>guide</del>, signal, or service dog <u>service animal as</u>
- 20 defined by § 20-14-304 or a dog trainer in the act of training a guide,
- 21 signal, or service dog service animal shall not be denied admittance to or
- 22 refused access to the following because of the dog animal:
- 23 (1) Any A street or highway;
- 24 (2) Any A sidewalk or walkway;

- 26 train, bus, streetcar, boat, or any other public conveyance or mode of
- 27 transportation;
- 28 (4) Any A hotel, motel, or other place of lodging;

- 31 (6) Any  $\underline{A}$  building to which the general public is invited;

Control. 32 (a)(1) A service animal as defined by § 20-14-304 shall be under the 33 control of its handler. 34

(2) A service animal shall have a harness, leash, or other

1	(A) The handler is unable because of a disability to use a		
2	harness, leash, or other tether; or		
3	(B) The use of a harness, leash, or other tether would

10	animal be removed from the premises if:		
11	(A) The service animal is not acting under the control of		
12	the handler and the handler does not take effective action to control the		
13	service animal; or		
14	(B) The service animal is not housebroken.		
15	(2) If a public entity or accommodation properly excludes a		
16	service animal under subdivision (b)(1) of this section, the public entity or		
17	accommodation shall give the individual with a disability the opportunity to		
18	participate in the service, program, or activity without the service animal		
19	on the premises.		
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21	20-14-311. Service animals for students in K-12 schools.		
22	(a) As used in this section, "care for" means the following activities		
23	without limitation:		
24	(1) Grooming;		
25	(2) Feeding or watering;		
26	(3) Exercising;		
27	(4) Removing the service animal for periodic voiding; and		
28	(5) Cleaning up after the service animal.		
29	(b) A kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) student who requires a		
30	service animal as defined by § 20-14-304 as an accommodation for his or her		
31	academic program shall submit a written request for the accommodation to the		
32	school disability coordinator at least thirty (30) days before the student		
33	intends to begin using the service animal in the school.		
34	(c)(1) No later than ten (10) school days after the receipt of the		
35	written request, the school disability coordinator shall convene a team to		
36	meet with the parent or legal quardian of the student to integrate the		

1	service animal into the academic program of the student.		
2	(2) The meeting may take place later than ten (10) school days		
3	after the receipt of the written request with the consent of the parent or		
4	legal guardian of the student.		
5	(3) The team shall include without limitation:		
6	(A) The school principal or his or her designee;		
7	(B) The school counselor;		
8	(C) At least one (1) teacher of the student;		
9	(D) A school nurse;		
10	(E) The parent or legal guardian of the student, if the		
11	parent or legal guardian chooses to attend; and		
12	(F) The student, if applicable.		
13	(4) If the student has an existing team under either a plan		
14	under 29 U.S.C. § 794 or an individualized education program under the		
15	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., the		
16	school disability coordinator shall meet with the existing team.		
17	(d) A kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) school is not required		
18	to hire new staff or assign existing staff to care for a service animal of a		
19	<u>student.</u>		
20	(e) This section does not apply to a student who is attending a		
21	school-sponsored event as a member of the general public.		
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
